Garden Grant Guidelines

2023 - 2024



The Allamanda Garden Club of North Port will award grants to assist those who wish to create, refurbish, or maintain public green spaces in the city of North Port, Florida. In addition, we support school programming with horticulture-related projects.

The objectives of the garden grants are to beautify the city of North Port, educate the community about horticulture, encourage members to become more active in the community, and increase the visibility and recognition of the Allamanda Garden Club.

Grant awards may be up to \$500.

Applicants must fill out an application that describes the garden, its location, plans for long-term maintenance and a complete plant list.

Grants may be renewable in subsequent years.

The Grant Application must be submitted to the board of directors for approval.

Additional notes:

The garden must be located in a public space in North Port (Example: public park, municipal grounds, public school garden, median strips, etc.)

An educational project must benefit residents of North Port.

The grant money is to be used to purchase plants (trees, shrubs, and perennials), soil amendments, compost, soil, or mulch as well as educational materials.

Applicants do not need to be members of The Allamanda Garden Club.

Applicants from surrounding areas will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

Plants on the Florida Invasive Plant list are not allowed. See this website for a complete list:
